The Most Unhappy Man

We are living in a time when people seem to be so unhappy. Even in our churches, Christians seem to be without joy.

Let's look at the unhappiest man we know of in the Bible: Jonah.

- 1. Jonah was unhappy with God's call (Jonah 1:1-3). He was angry because God called him to go and preach.
- 2. Jonah was unhappy because of the place to which God called him (1:1-3). If God was going to impose on him, surely He could have called him to a better place than Nineveh!
- 3. Jonah made everyone around him unhappy (1:4-17). They were unhappy because of Jonah's presence on the ship. Jonah was asleep... and he couldn't have cared less about those around him.
- 4. Jonah was unhappy with his classroom (the fish's belly), but he learned four things (ch. 2):
 - a) discipline (vss. 1-2)
 - b) repentance (vs. 4)
 - c) mercy (vs. 8)
 - d) salvation and praise (vs. 9)
- 5. Jonah was unhappy because the people repented (ch. 3). When all of Nineveh repented (4:1), Jonah was even more unhappy!
- 6. Jonah was unhappy because he lived to see God's kindness toward a people he hated (4:2).
- 7. Jonah was unhappy because God took away his temporary shelter, a vine (4:6-7). He thought more of the vine than the people of Nineveh (4:10)!

The unhappiest people are those who will not accept God's will for their lives.
